


At The Children's Theatre of Cincinnati, we believe theatre is for everyone. That's why we are so excited to present the fourth season of MainStage Sensory-Friendly performances at the Taft Theatre.

These are special performances intended for individuals with developmental disabilities including those on the autism spectrum who may benefit and their classmates and families, not for the general public. Only a limited number of tickets will be sold. This season we are happy to present two performances during the weekday for school groups and families, and one performance on the weekendso families who can't get away during the week are able to attend and make memories together.

To create a "sensory-friendly" performance:

- The show is performed in a welcoming, supportive environment for those with sensory challenges.
- Slight adjustments to lighting and sound are made for the performance. Effects such as fog, strobes, and lights that extend into the audience are minimalized.
- In the theater lobby, there is an area staffed by specialists in the field where patrons and families can take a break from the performance if needed.
- A downloadable Social Narrative (in Word format) with pictures of the theater and the production are available on our website, designed to personalize the experience for individuals wishing to prepare for the show. These will be posted one week prior to each production.
- Additional resources for the performance, such as a Character Guide, and a Guide to Attending the Show will also be available one week prior to each production.
- A committee of experts in the field was created to aid TCT with these performances, including staff members from Theatre Development Fund's Autism Theatre Initiative the organization that implements sensory-friendly performances on Broadway, along with members from CCHMC/ Cincinnati Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental and Related Disabilities (LEND) program, Autism Society of Greater Cincinnati, Cincinnati Occupational Therapy Institute, Down Syndrome Association of Greater Cincinnati, The Point/Arc of Northern Kentucky, The Children's Home of Cincinnati and Q102.

All MainStage performances will be held at the Taft Theatre, 317 East Fifth Street, Cincinnati, OH 45202. Conveniently located at the corner of 5th and Sycamore in downtown Cincinnati.

The shows last approximately 60 minutes without intermission.
