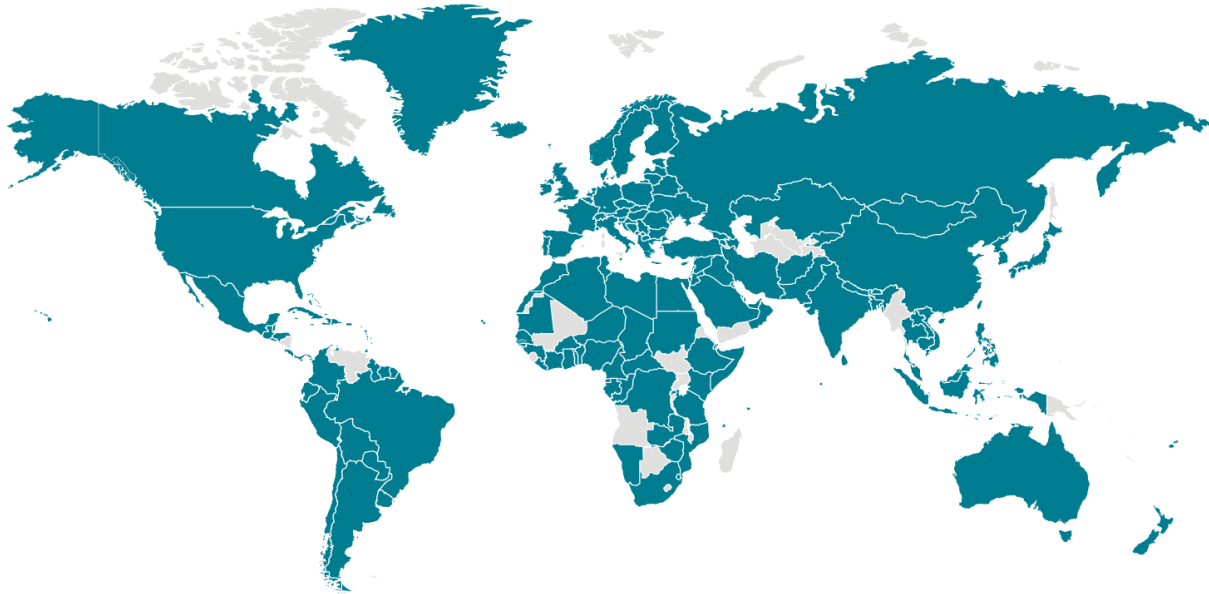


How Do I Get Tested For COVID-19?

Your nurse or doctor might wear a mask too.

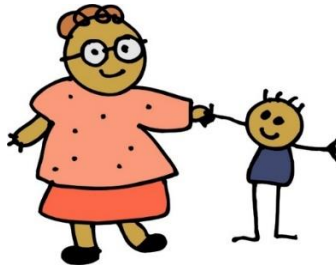
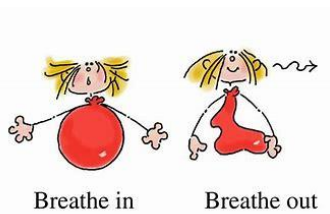


The COVID-19 test is NOT a shot.
Your doctor will use a large Q-tip to wipe the back of
your throat or inside your nose.



This might tickle or feel weird, but it will not hurt.

Some kids might feel scared and that's okay.
Remember to take deep breaths, count to 10,
or hold someone's hand.



If you are still feeling sick when you get home, you
should rest. Drink lots of water, try not to touch your
face, and don't forget to *wash your hands!*
